EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1 The FREEDOM PROGRAMME

is a complement to our holistic project of 300,000 efficient cookstoves to help THE LOCAL COMMUNITY, mitigate CLIMATE CHANGE and IMPROVE HEALTH.

2 It will give an opportunity to

100 female students

to work in the distribution of cookstoves, allowing them to pay for University without having to sell themselves.

This programme will give the

FREEDOM OF CHOICE

to women and improve their HEALTH by avoiding the risk of sexually transmittable diseases and abortion.

The Institute of Medicine of the University of Lomé will be monitoring the benefits.

The programme aims to raise at least

€ 180.000 /year

from 2024 to 2028.



BEING A WOMAN IN TOGO

Womens' participation in education in Togo drops from 72% in primary schools to only 14% in secondary education.

One of the reasons for this extremely high decrease is due to early pregnancies, lack of sex education, absence of family planning.

25% of women are married under the age of 18.

Families concentrate their scarce resources on the education of the elder son only.

The access to University and the costs of living in the city are very expensive and the girls desiring to study MUST PROVIDE FOR THEMSELVES.

Many female students are turning to prostitution to support themselves at University.

Receiving something in exchange for sex is quite common among sexually active, unmarried female adolescents in Togo.

The **TOGO COOKSTOVES** project is producing and distributing 300,000 improved cookstoves over 5 years

Two types of locally made stoves (asuto and himalayan) are being distributed. The use of locally made stoves offer vast socioeconomic advantages over projects which import stoves.

The project provides technical and marketing training to local potters and local welders, as well as offering environmental education to the community

Evidence shows that these improved stoves reduce fuel consumption by around 35-40% compared to traditional stoves. The project targets households and artisans in the Plateaux, Maritime and Centrale regions of Togo, which comprises about two-thirds of Togo's total population.



The FREEDOM programme for 2024

We will work in collaboration with the Department of Medicine of the University of Lomé to monitor the positive impact on the health of the women involved in the project.

We shall involve 100 girls during the first year of the programme by offering them a part time job which can be combined with the study.

They will also be helping other women to understand the importance of using the most efficient COOKSTOVES for their health and that of their children.

The cost of the programme for one year involves the investment of €150 /month for each girl

100 jobs x €150/month = €15,000/month €15,000/month x 12 months = €180,000/year

The monitoring of the University of Lomé will be shared with the donors.
