#### **BACKGROUND**

On behalf of Action Against Hunger's Ethiopia office, we are truly grateful for your recent visit to Ethiopia and for your meeting with Ethiopia's senior management team. The meeting discussed the challenging context in which we operate and underscored the critical importance of allocating additional resources to security enhancement and overall staff well-being.

In recent years, our organization has witnessed an increase in security threats and challenges in the regions where we operate. Ethiopia is one of the most dangerous humanitarian contexts in the world. As we continue to carry out our lifesaving efforts in these volatile and often remote environments throughout Ethiopia, ensuring the safety and well-being of our dedicated staff members across 29 field offices has become our top priority. Action Against Hunger-Ethiopia would not reach 2.9 million Ethiopians each year without our staff's tireless efforts in the fight against hunger.

We request financial support to improve security measures and staff well-being in our highest risk field offices. We are seeking financial support in the amount of \$100,000 to implement a comprehensive security and staff well-being program.

#### PROPOSED SCOPE OF WORK

This program will focus on the following key areas:

## Security Training and Capacity Building:

 Provide five specialized security training programs (HEAT) for our field staff to improve their ability to assess risks, implement security protocols, and respond effectively to emergencies.

## Infrastructure and Equipment Enhancement:



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- Construct seven safe rooms in our highest risk field offices for staff protection and shelter in case of emergency situations. These secure spaces offer staff refuge and protection during emergencies, defend staff against armed attacks and other threats, contain essential medical supplies, and provide staff with a sense of security and psychological support.
- Install five solar-powered systems for security equipment and infrastructure to fortify our field offices against external threats. The systems would include solar-powered surveillance cameras, perimeter fencing lights, and other crucial safety infrastructure.

### Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS):

- Implement Mental Health and Psychosocial Support (MHPSS) programs to address the psychological impact of working in high-stress and often traumatic environments.
- Provide counseling services, stress management workshops, and peer support networks to promote the mental health and resilience of our staff members.

#### **IMPACT AND OUTCOMES:**

By investing in our security and staff well-being program, your generous support will:

- Improve the safety and security of our staff members, enabling them to carry out their humanitarian work effectively and with confidence, reaching 2.9 million Ethiopians in need a year.
- Improve the overall well-being and resilience of our team, fostering a supportive and healthy work environment.
- Strengthen our organization's capacity to respond to emergencies and crises, ensuring the continuity of operations and service delivery in the face of adversity.

### **BUDGET AND FINANCIALS**
